Navin Puri presented overview of BJA Federal Grant Required Allocation, the FY2021 priorities (Local Law Enforcement Block Grants and Statewide Training Grants), and FY2022 Proposed Priorities. Refer to attachment 5/CJI Power Point.

FY2022 Proposed Priorities – Details:

Navin Puri presented details for the FY 2022 proposed priorities.

- -No Match will be required on any priority.
- -No unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV'S) or drones will be funded.
- -Vehicle purchases for any type of vehicle (all-terrain vehicle, four wheelers, gator, and/or trailers) that requires North Carolina DMV registration are not allowed.
- -Maintenance or rental/leases are not allowed.

Contingency:

Navin Puri called attention to all awards to be contingent upon the Governor's Crime Commission receiving the Byrne JAG grant funds from the U.S. Department of Justice. All Byrne JAG awards must comply with any new special conditions in the Federal Fiscal Year 2022. Refer to attachment 5/ CJI Power Point.

FY2022 Proposed Priorities – Voting:

CJI committee members proceeded voting on all four of the FY2022 proposed program priorities; Local Law Enforcement Block Grants, Accreditation Priority, Crisis Intervention Training, and Mental Health/Law Enforcement Pilot Project.

Daniel House moved motion to approve the proposed priorities, James Williams seconded. The motion passed with 9 votes in favor, 0 against, 1 abstain. Refer to attachment 4/CJI roll call for voting and attachment 6/CJI Sheriff Hans Miller Recusal Form.

Old Business: Navin Puri conducted the governing body review that is required for the 2021 Byrne-JAG Application that was submitted earlier in the summer. The Application was for the full allocation amount of 4.6 million dollars and was submitted by the deadline. This application is still being reviewed in Washington and the Governor's Crime Commission is still awaiting receipt of the Award and Special Conditions.



BJA Funding Trends





BJA Federal Grant Required Allocation

- The Federal Pass Through for the 2021 JAG Award is 55%. This represents that at least 55% of the award must be passed through to local law enforcement agencies.
- This pass through is set by BJA every year.
- Agencies (localities) that are not large enough to qualify for a direct JAG Award are encouraged to apply to GCC for assistance.

FY 2021 Priorities

LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT BLOCK GRANTS

Federal Funding Maximum - \$ 24,500 – 1 YEAR ONLY Grant funding under this priority is ONLY available to local law enforcement agencies.

STATEWIDE TRAINING AND STATEWIDE ACCREDITATION PRIORITY

Federal Funding Maximum - \$ 200,000 – 1 YEAR ONLY

FY 2021 Grants Overall

Local Law Enforcement **Block Grants**

- 203 Grants Submitted
- > \$ 4,732,094.93 in **Federal Funding**

Statewide Training Grants

- 5 Grants Submitted
- \$ 571,869.96 in Federal **Funding**
- Total Amount Funded (2021): \$5,303,965
- Note: The reason the GCC has been able to fund more than is awarded is that staff is able to award funds not expended and/or reverted from older JAG awards. This flexibility has helped the CJI Committee meet additional requests over the last few grant cycles.



FY 2021 Statewide Training Grants

- 2021 NCDOJ CJ Standards Division Statewide Accreditation Priority - Department of Justice
 - This project will develop and assist to maintain a program to accredit law enforcement agencies in North Carolina. Funds will be used to employ two full-time program managers to run this statewide program.
- ▶ 2021 DPS NCNG Counterdrug Program- Mid Atlantic Narcotics Training Academy – DPS
 - The NCNG Counterdrug Program will conduct advanced counter narcotics law enforcement training through the Mid-Atlantic Narcotics Training Academy. By leveraging NCNG resources, MANTA will devote all grant funds to instructor services and provision of training at no cost to law enforcement officers.



FY 2022 Proposed Priorities

1. LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT BLOCK GRANTS

- ▶ Federal Funding Maximum \$ 24,500 1 YEAR ONLY
 - Equipment, psychological testing or combination of both
- Grant funding under this priority is ONLY available to local law enforcement agencies that do not receive a direct JAG award.

2. ACCREDITATION PRIORITY

- ▶ Federal Funding Maximum (State Agency) \$ 400,000 Up to 2 years.
- ▶ Federal Funding Maximum (Local Agency) \$ 50,000 − Up to 2 Years.



FY 2022 Proposed Priorities Continued

3. CRISIS INTERVENTION TRAINING

- Federal Funding Maximum (Regional) \$ 200,000 Up to 2 years. Providing training in 3 or more counties.
- Federal Funding Maximum (Local) \$ 75,000 Up to 2 Years.

4. MENTAL HEALTH/LEO MODEL PILOT PROJECT

(Local Law Enforcement Agencies Only – Up to 2 years)

- Federal Funding Maximum: \$75,000/yr for Small Category
- Federal Funding Maximum: \$ 125,000/yr for Middle Category
- Federal Funding Maximum: \$ 225,000/yr for Large Category



FY 2022 Proposed Priorities - Details

- NO MATCH WILL BE REQUIRED ON ANY PRIORITY.
- PLEASE TAKE NOTE OF CEILING CAPS FOR EACH PRIORITY. PROPOSALS THAT EXCEED THESE THRESHOLDS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR FUNDING.
- NO UNMANNED ARIEL VEHICLES (UAV'S) OR DRONES CAN BE REQUESTED.
- VEHICLE PURCHASES FOR ANY TYPE OF VEHICLE (ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES, FOUR-WHEELERS, GATORS, AND/OR TRAILERS) THAT REQUIRE NORTH CAROLINA DMV REGISTRATION ARE NOT ALLOWED.
- **MAINTENANCE OR RENTAL/LEASES ARE NOT ALLOWED.**



Contingency

- All awards are contingent upon the GCC receiving the Byrne JAG grant funds from the U.S. Department of Justice.
- All awards must comply with any new special conditions in the FFY2022 Byrne JAG award.
