Call to Order and Roll Call:

Chair Patrice Andrews called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m. and a roll call was taken.

Reminders:

Ethics: Chair Andrews reminded the members of the General Statue, Chapter 138A-35, and other provisions of the State Government Ethics Act/Recusal.

Review and Approval of Minutes:

Chair Andrews called attention to the meeting minutes for May 11, 2021. May 19, 2021 and June 3, 2021. Karen Howard moved to approve minutes; Hoyt Tessener seconded. The minutes were approved by the CVS Committee.

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Updates – Funding GCC CVS FY 2021:

Sandy Dixon, GCC Lead Crime Victim Services Planner, provided an overview of the GCC CVS Priorities 2021 VAWA and VOCA Applications.

Grant Funding Priorities Cycle 2022 Application Review by Committee:

Chair Andrews led the discussion regarding funding recommendations for FFY 2022 GCC CVS Priorities for VAWA & VOCA Applications.

VAWA is recommended as follows:

- Courts will remain non-competitive as this allocation can only go to the courts.
- Victim Services allocation will be increased to 35% by taking 5% from Discretionary
- Law Enforcement and Prosecutors will change to allow for less than 2 FTEs capped at \$100,000 and 2 or more FTEs capped at \$150,000. NOTE: An addition to these priorities were made after the committee meeting and voted on at the full GCC meeting on September 2, 2021 to allow for Training for Frontline Staff capped at \$55,000 for regional trainings and \$200,000 for statewide training for sworn officers and prosecutors.
- Discretionary is decreased by 5% from 15% to 10% in order to increase Victim Services from 30% to 35%. Discretionary will retain Batterer's Intervention Programs capped at \$55,000 for programs serving an individual county and \$100,000 for programs serving multiple counties. Prevention Programs are retained and capped at \$55,000.
- Overall, agencies may only submit one application under each GCC Funding Priority Service Area for the STOP program. NOTE: A <u>prosecutorial district</u> is a single subrecipient. Additional applications will not be considered for funding.
- As funding is limited, agencies requesting funding for continuation projects in the <u>Victim Services</u> and <u>Discretionary priorities</u> are limited to <u>level funding for a continuation project's application so that</u> the federal share of the project cannot increase from the previous year.

Motion: Susan Osborne made the motion and Hoyt Tessener seconded the motion – To accept the 2022 VAWA projected funding allocation as they were just reviewed and move to a vote.

VOCA is recommended as follows:

• Non-competitive categories of domestic violence/sexual assault and child advocacy centers are retained.

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- Competitive categories are changed as follows:
 - ➤ Underserved is updated to include Human Trafficking, which is eliminated as its own priority, and startup child advocacy centers, which is also eliminates as its own priority.
 - ➤ Legal Services is retained.
 - > Specialized Services and Models will be added and includes
 - Hospital-based services
 - Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) Services
 - Forensic medical examinations (not associated with sexual assault basic services)
 - Forensic interviews
 - Emergency medical assistance not covered by victim compensation funds
 - Mental health and substance use disorder services
 - Collaborative / Multi-Agency Models (Family Justice Centers)
 - ➤ Victim Focused Violence Intervention is added and includes:
 - Community violence intervention programs
 - Hospital-based violence intervention programs
 - Restorative justice programs
- Other Services, Child Advocacy Center startups and Human Trafficking are moved to Underserved and eliminated as stand-alone priorities.
- All funding priorities are of **equal importance**, regardless of their listed order.
- VOCA priorities are divided into two categories: Basic (noncompetitive and based on a formula) and Competitive
 - ➤ Basic Services Applications:
 - The following projects are federally mandated priorities and are for designated agencies only, based on a GCC formula, and agencies will be contacted by GCC with their funding amounts by 11/1/2021:
 - Sexual assault/domestic violence, and
 - Child advocacy center for accredited / provisionally accredited CACs
 - ➤ Competitive Applications:
 - All competitive priorities do not have established caps; however, they are limited to 0% growth for any project that is submitting a continuation application.

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Motion: Patricia Lawler made the motion and Karen Howard seconded the motion—To approve the priorities as noted by staff for the VOCA 2022.

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CVS Funding FY 2021

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Priorities 2021 Applications

North Carolina Department of Public Safety

- Reminder of the VAWA 2021 priorities:
 - Application Submission Limits: Agencies may only submit ONE application under each GCC Funding Priority Service Area for the STOP program. **NOTE:** A prosecutorial district is a single subrecipient. Additional applications will not be considered for funding.
 - **Growth:** As funding is limited, agencies requesting funding for continuation projects are limited to level funding, the federal share of the project cannot increase from the previous year.

Priority	Maximum Federal Share
State and Local Courts	Statewide Training Grant – Non Competitive
Victim Services	Up to \$200,000
Law Enforcement	Up to \$140,000
Prosecutors	Up to \$140,000
Discretionary	Batterer's Intervention Programs: Up to \$55,000 for individual regions and up to \$100,000* for programs that propose to expand and serve multiple regions. Prevention Programs: Up to \$55,000

Priorities 2021 Applications

- Reminder of the VOCA 2021 priorities:
 - Application Submission Limits: Agencies may submit no more than THREE (3) total competitive applications with only one application per program priority. Additional applications will not be considered for funding. This total is not inclusive of any DV/SA or CAC Basic Services projects.
 - Growth: As funding is limited, agencies requesting funding for continuation projects are limited to level funding, the federal share of the project cannot increase from the previous year.

2021 VOCA - Child Advocacy Centers Basic Services (Designated agencies only)
2021 VOCA - Sexual Assault/Domestic Violence Basic Services (Designated agencies only)
2021 VOCA - Child Abuse Victims
2021 VOCA - Collaborative / Multi-Agency Models (Family Justice Centers)
2021 VOCA - Victims of Human Trafficking
2021 VOCA - Legal Services for Victims of Crime
2021 VOCA - Other Services for Victims of Crime

Funding Information

- VAWA is anticipated to be stable, may have slight increase
- ▶ The <u>concern</u> is with VOCA
 - 2021 = \$34.4M
 - Reduction from a high of \$103.4M in 2018
 - 66.8888% decrease since 2018
