
### FY20-21 Relative Rate Index

- Data comes directly from the Juvenile Database NCJOIN
- June 1, 2020 July 21, 2021 at each decision point
  - 1. Arrest
  - Diversion (filing of charges)
  - 3. Pre-trial detention
  - 4. Disposition commitments
  - Adult Transfer
- RRIs use the rate for whites as the base number. In circumstances where the occurrence for equals zero, RRI cannot be calculated

OJJDP no longer requires RRI to measure DMC




