#### Call to Order: Chair Evans

GCC Chair, Robert Evans, called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

#### Review and Approval of Minutes: Chair Evans

Chair Evans called attention to the meeting minutes of March 4, 2020. The minutes were approved by the Commission board members.

#### Reminders:

Ethics: Chair Evans reminded the members of the General Statute, Chapter 138A-35, and other provisions of the State Government Ethics Act/Recusal.

Voting: Executive Director, Caroline C. Valand, reminded members of the COVID-19 Response Bill rules relating to remote meeting. Members were required to introduce themselves every time they spoke and that all votes would be taken via roll call.

#### Secretary Hooks comments:

- Day 87 of the State Emergency Operation due to COVID-19.

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- The impact of George Floyd’s death and the need for redress, reconciliation and healing as well as the continued efforts to address disparities in many communities.

**GCC Executive Director Report:** Caroline C. Valand:

- All monitoring was being done remotely per federal guidance.
- 3 webinars were hosted for subrecipients.
- Many of the subrecipients were unable to provide services or have fundraisers. They have new needs, for example, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and hotels for victims.
- Federal partners have continued to pay subrecipients’ staff, granted more match waivers, extended grants and adjusted budgets.
- Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding (CESF). It followed the CARES Act. It followed Byrne JAG formula for allocation but it was not Byrne JAG funding. The purpose was to assist states with preparing for and responding to COVID-19. North Carolina received \$15,000,000.00. Applications were being accepted and reviewed as received.
- Funding:
  - VOCA’s FY 2018 was \$104,000,000.00. FY 2020 it was \$52,000,000.00 less.
  - VAWA was not reauthorized but would still be funded.
  - Byrne JAG’s backlog was mostly caught up but the litigation continued.
  - JJ ‘s FY 2018 funding was finally approved.
- Setting Priorities. Subrecipients needed to reduce total number of priorities and limit continuation of funding growth, due to continued restriction of dollars. Committees should consider spending caps.

**Governor’s 2020-2021 Priorities:** Sarah Bolton, Policy Director, Office of the Governor (attachments 1 and 2)

1. Keeping schools and communities safe.
2. Support law enforcement as a profession.
3. Prioritizing the state’s work to fight opioid addiction.
4. Improving the safety of correctional staff and prison facilities.
5. Ensuring first responders have access to PPE.
6. Help victims of sexual assault.
7. Stop human trafficking.
8. Help victims of domestic violence and stalking.
9. Protect seniors.
10. Additional victim support.

**Bond Reform Updates:** Timothy Parker, Director, Criminal Justice Analysis Center (CJAC)

On March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2019, GCC received a presentation from Professor Jessica Smith, of the UNC School of Government. The presentation was on Bond Reform and Bond Initiative throughout North Carolina. The GCC formed a small working group. Some issues they discussed included: lack of comprehensive data, need for funding, procedural issues, public perception and purpose-driven opportunities that GCC can pursue in bond reform. The working group was asked to rank initiatives by most significant positive change, rank strategies by statewide focus, and to identify products that the Commission can act upon. As a result, in March 2020, the CJAC wrote a paper, *Justice Analysis Review*, in March 2020. The working group then came up with 3 initiatives for pretrial release in North Carolina.

Working Group Summary: Julius H. Corpening II, Chief District Court Judge, New Hanover County (attachment 3)

Priorities recommended for pretrial reform in North Carolina:

1. Training for law enforcement and magistrates on citations/summons in lieu of arrest.
2. Encouraging timely first appearances for all defendants (including misdemeanors).
3. Updating bond policies.

Chair Evans presented the following recommendations:

1. Enhance law enforcement and magistrate training in the use of citations and summons in lieu of arrest.
2. Mandatory and timely first appearances on all incarcerated defendants (including misdemeanors).
3. Updating bond policies including training and providing judges additional risk assessment tools.

Comments: Many counties do not have pre-trial procedures in place so that was a huge step forward without putting on additional financial constraints. Often offenders who were not provided timely first-time appearance stayed in jail for weeks or months waiting for a court date without the benefit of counsel and not being able to pay a cash bond. A member commented that if every district updated its own policy, someone in one county may be treated differently than in another county, therefore, a template was necessary for consistency.

Sexual Assault: 20% of award across 2 or more allocations, not Discretionary – \$1,274,384.91.

- Currently short in the Culturally Specific and Sexual Assault Mandatory set asides. The CVS team has developed a plan using unused and reverted funds from FY 2019 and 2020 to meet those set asides.

 Criminal Justice Improvement Committee – Alan Cloninger (attachment 6)

Applications received: 129 law enforcement block grants, basically for equipment.  
 Requested funding: \$2,970,110.00.

One law enforcement non-profit did not meet required criteria and was denied.  
 Statewide training projects requested was \$602,091.00. All were eligible for consideration.

CJI Committee recommended that the 128 local law enforcement block grants for \$2,945,610.00 along with the 6 statewide training projects, a total of 134 projects, totaling \$3,547,791.89 be approved.

Juvenile Justice Planning Committee (JJPC) – Reverend Bruce Stanley (attachment 7)

Priorities adapted by JJPC for FY2020:

- Raise the Age Implementation
- School Justice Partnership
- Racial and Ethnic Disparity
- Children’s Justice Act

Children’s Justice Act had separate funds allocated. It was dedicated to driving out systemic changes and not for providing direct services.

- 4 applications received, 2 disallowed (did not meet the criteria, for direct services).  
 2 grants approved, requested funding \$481,093.87.

Date: May 4, 2020

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This memo will describe the Governor's 2020-2021 priorities for the Governor's Crime Commission.

**Key Priorities**

Keeping schools and communities safe

- Common sense, evidence-based initiatives to prevent gun violence and make communities safer.
- Emergency response planning so that school maps, panic alarms, and other tools are ready in case of a critical incident.
- Additional school nurses, counselors, psychologists, social workers, and other support staff so that problems can be identified and addressed earlier.
- Additional SROs and effective training so that they can be the eyes and ears for students and educators.
- Safer structures on campuses, including K-12 schools and post-secondary institutions.
- Continued cooperation between law enforcement and schools to prepare for and prevent critical incidents like school shootings.

### Support law enforcement as a profession

- Encourage better training, pay and benefits for law enforcement.
- Improve community police interactions.
  - Encourage training to avoid unnecessary escalation during interactions between officers and community members.
  - Encourage community support of law enforcement as a vital profession and to understand the risks that law enforcement officers take daily.

### Prioritizing the state's work to fight opioid addiction

- Reduce flow of illicit opioids, including fentanyl, by giving law enforcement the tools to go after traffickers.
- Develop creative ways to expand accessibility to treatment and prioritize appropriate treatment methods.
- Ensure that naloxone is available to first responders and others who can make effective use of this medication to treat overdoses.
- Support law enforcement programs that divert individuals who want help into treatment.
- Prioritize initiatives that save the youngest victims, children, and their families from opioid-related harm.

### Improving the safety of correctional staff and prison facilities

- The Department continues working to improve the safety and well-being of correctional staff and incarcerated people, but more resources are needed to make prisons safer.
- Improving public safety by investing in reentry programs to prevent repeat offenses
- Build community capacity to address barriers to reentry like access to housing, employment, and transportation.
- Continue efforts to help individuals prepare for the transition from prison to community supervision.
- Ensure individuals recently released from prison have access to any needed substance use disorder treatment.

### Ensuring first responders have access to PPE

- Ensure first responders have adequate access to Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to protect themselves and others from COVID-19 while giving critical care.

## **Ongoing Priorities**

### Help victims of sexual assault

- Ensure that law enforcement and the State Crime Lab have the right resources for DNA analysis and that victims can track testing.
- Ensure that the stigma of reporting is no longer a barrier for victims of sexual assault.
- Work to prevent assault by trusted caregivers.

### Stop human trafficking

- Prosecute perpetrators but also work to train our communities to recognize and report human trafficking when they see it.

### Help victims of domestic violence and stalking

- Help victims get access to tools they need to protect themselves and their families.
- Provide resources for training to help law enforcement better understand victims and ultimately reduce any stigma around reporting domestic violence and stalking.

### Protect seniors

- The senior population will double in the next 20 years, so it is even more important that communities can detect and stop the scam artists who prey upon this aging population.
- Work to prevent abuse by trusted caregivers, including those in facilities for the elderly.

### Additional victim support

- Ensure victims have a voice in court through custody mediators and Guardian Ad Litem volunteers.

### Special Working Group: Pretrial Reform

**Group Purpose:** The time-limited working group was established to examine the issue of pretrial reform in North Carolina.

**Issue:**

The current bail system gives individuals charged with a criminal offense the opportunity to be released from custody before their case is resolved. North Carolina General Statutes provide the following conditions of release to be set by a magistrate or judge: 1) a written promise to appear; 2) unsecured bond; 3) designated custody of person or organization; 4) secured bond; and 5) electronic monitoring. The statute further states that the first three should be imposed unless there is concern the defendant will not appear for court or will pose a danger to any person. This rationale is congruent with the Eighth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution which provides protections from "excessive bail" requirements.

**Process and Discussion:**

The Governor's Crime Commission formed a working group of Commissioners to examine pretrial reform in North Carolina. The pretrial reform working group included Public Defenders, Chief District Court Judges, Chiefs of Police, District Attorneys, and Sheriffs from jurisdictions across the state. The group gathered information and met several times to discuss the current state of pretrial procedures in North Carolina as well as recent reform initiatives taking place in North Carolina and across the county. 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Professor Jessica Smith of the UNC School of Government and discussed the lack of comprehensive data on jail populations, the need for funding of pilot programs, public perception of reform initiatives, and procedural issues. The working group voted on a list of initiatives developed by the Attorney General<sup>1</sup> and considers the following three items to be the most prudent in addressing the issue of pretrial reform in North Carolina:

#### **Training for law enforcement and magistrates on citations/summons in lieu of arrest**

Encouraging agencies to use citations or summons in lieu of arrest reduces the amount of time law enforcement officers spend addressing violations to the law. It still holds low-risk individuals accountable for their failure to comply with the law while decreasing the number of people and accompanying expenses of jails and pretrial service programs, without forcing disproportionate financial and legal burdens or life disruptions due to jail time. When arrests are made, magistrates are the first point of possible diversion from detention. With appropriate training and authority, they can help direct people to substance use disorder/mental health treatment programs, appoint attorneys, and make individualized, risk based pretrial release decisions.

#### **Providing timely first appearances for all defendants (including misdemeanors)**

There is no required timeframe for first appearance hearings for all defendants. A policy that would require first appearances for defendants being held in custody for misdemeanor charges within a certain period of time, such as 96 hours, could aid in reducing the number of persons being held in jails before the resolution of their cases. This would include early involvement of appointed counsel with access to defendants in jail and prior record history, to properly represent them at all hearings.

#### **Updating bond policies**

North Carolina General Statutes place the responsibility of establishing bond policies with the senior resident superior court judge in consultation with the chief district court judges in each judicial district.<sup>2</sup> Bond policies are critical to pretrial release decisions and are currently not updated regularly in all districts. The pretrial system would run more efficiently and fairly if policies included the statutory preference for non-financial conditions of release and a requirement for written reasons when secured bonds are imposed. The system must ensure the safety of the public and the officers entrusted to protect the public, providing supervision to defendants awaiting trial, and ensuring that defendants return to court. The inclusion of

subject matter experts to assist in the development of local bond policies with reviews set for a regular time period would ensure that policies remain up to date. Reforms need consistent involvement of a broad range of stakeholders, including judges, prosecutors, public defenders, law enforcement, and community organizations.
